ADMINISTRATIVE ANNOUNCEMENTS

REMINDER! Acknowledge, link and submit!

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) implemented a law in 2008 requiring that all investigators funded by NIH funds submit an electronic version of their peer-reviewed manuscript to the National Library of Medicine's PubMed Central *upon acceptance for publication* so that it may be made publicly available. A link to the law can be found here: <https://publicaccess.nih.gov/policy.htm>. Per the NIH Public Access Policy, manuscripts are to be submitted to the NIH Manuscript Submission System (NIHMS) within three months of *acceptance* for publication. Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the Public Access Policy may result in the placement of special conditions on current awards or preclusion of grantees from obtaining future NIH funding.

WVCTSI funding from grant U54 GM104942 falls under the NIH Public Access Policy; therefore, any manuscript arising from an investigator whose salary, education, or research activities are funded all or in part by WVCTSI funding must adhere to the Public Access Policy. This also applies to manuscripts from investigators that use WVCTSI core program resources (biostatistics, bioinformatics, etc.). Compliance with the Public Access Policy *does not* require payment of an open access fee.

To comply with the NIH public access policy, the following steps are necessary:

1. Acknowledge funding in each publication on which you are an author in the appropriate section of the manuscript through the following statement:
"Research reported in this publication was supported by the National Institute of General Medical Sciences of the National Institutes of Health under Award Number U54GM104942. The content is solely the responsibility of the authors and does not necessarily represent the official views of the National Institutes of Health."
2. Link the publication from PubMed to NIH grant U54GM104942.
3. Submit the manuscript to the NIHMS upon acceptance for inclusion in [PubMed Central](#).

WVCTSI thanks you for your assistance in ensuring that funding is accurately cited in publications and manuscripts adhere to the NIH Public Access Policy.

Please be mindful that submissions to the NIHMS must adhere to the copyright
