The National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIDDK) is accepting applications for a program that provides NIDDK-supported K01, K08, and K23 recipients an opportunity to apply for R03 support at some point during the final two years of their K award. This program seeks to enhance the ability of K award recipients to conduct research as they complete their transition to fully independent investigator status.
